As for me, I shall take my old accustomed place, Near enough to God to hear Him, and know He is there, But not so far from men as not to hear them, And remember they are there too. Where? Outside the door— Thousands of them, millions of them. But—more important for me— One of them, two of them, ten of them, Whose hands I am intended to put on the latch, So I shall stay by the door and wait For those who seek it. 'I had rather be a door-keeper . . . ' So I stay near the door.

It's obvious but it's worth noting that to reach out to others we have to be in reach of them.

Nazarene Compassionate Ministries News

Through gifts given by Nazarenes to NCM last year, people received immediate care around the globe when lives were torn apart by hurricanes, earthquakes, mudslides, floods, disease outbreak, and famine. They didn't have to wait for funds to be raised. In many cases, that quick response for care made the difference between life and death.

- * When Hurricane Maria hit Dominica, a Nazarene church opened its doors. While people huddled in the bottom floor, winds ripped the roof off of the top-floor sanctuary and most nearby homes were destroyed. Many of those gathered in the church would have died if the church hadn't been there to open its doors for shelter.
- * When Hurricane Harvey pounded Houston, many nearby Nazarene churches provided shelter and met needs for displaced families as well as assisting with home repairs.
- * When heavy rains in Sierra Leone caused the side of a mountain to collapse, over 1,000 died. Many thousands lost their homes.
- * When earthquakes shook in Mexico, Nazarenes were there to help.

In addition to food, water and medical care given to these displaced families, Nazarene workers provided spiritual care and hope by listening and praying with those who had lost homes, possessions, and loved ones, reminding them that God loves them and is on their side.

Alabaster Offering February 25

The first Alabaster Offering was received in 1949. From 1949 - 2016, Nazarenes around the world have given \$112,424,798 to buy land or purchase buildings for churches, chapels, Bible schools and other school buildings, mission and district centers, hospitals and clinics, and homes for missionaries and national workers.

Your Alabaster Offering will help rebuild in areas affected by storms and earthquakes last year. It will also help build or purchase more facilities for worship and schools for Bible-based education, more medical facilities, and homes for more missionaries and pastors. Most of the funds are used in countries around the world, but some are also used for projects in the U.S. and Canada.

On Sunday, February 25, bring your offering in your Alabaster box or write a check. If you don't have an Alabaster box to save your change in, pick one up in the foyer.
